#### LAST CHANCE TO TAKE THE OUTDOOR STEAM PUMP RANCH TOUR!

The Oro Valley Historical Society is presenting the last docent-guided tours of the Historic Steam Pump Ranch property on April 24! Find out what makes Steam Pump Ranch stand out in local history and earned it a spot on the National Register of Historic Places.

Tours leave on the hour and every fifteen minutes thereafter, between 10 a.m. and 11:45 (the last tour). Tours are about 50 minutes. Each tour is limited to 6 participants. First come first serve...no reservations. Check in at the south end of the Farmer's Market. Look for the Oro Valley Historical Society tent. Be sure to dress for the weather and bring water. Suggested donation is \$5 per person to help our continued programs and exhibits.

## **NEWS FROM THE MARCH ANNUAL MEETING**

The Society and the Town of Oro Valley have completed an agreement for the OVHS use of office space in the Pusch House. This was the culmination of a long negotiation process. It will give OVHS more exclusive use of the office space and will allow for storage space as well...The Heritage Garden received a \$5,000 grant. Also, the Town of Oro Valley refunded the \$5,000 from the Garage Concept Design Study...We have had increased visits to both our website and Facebook, including over 400 "hits" on the recent Ina Gittings article...Sue Chambasian reported that the outdoor tours have been successful and are gaining momentum each week...Teri Colmar encouraged members to sign up for the Fry's



Community Awards program and designate OVHS for the donation. This can be done through the OVHS website....Joyce Rychener reported that the Heritage Garden is participating in the Native Seed Search to preserve pure, heirloom seeds. Joyce will be creating the Steam Pump Ranch Book Trail inside the garden, featuring book stations for diverse age groups. The Heritage Garden will serve as a Monarch waystation, with milkweed species to attract butterflies...Alice Hutchinson was introduced as the new Volunteer Chair. She plans training sessions for docents in the near future...Paul Loomis reported that he is working with TEP and the Town to supply electricity to the Tack Room. This could improve working conditions in that space and provide temperature control... Lynanne Silverthorn-Dellerman explained that the Celebrate Oro Valley program will continue for the year, with virtual programs centered on five pillars of local history. The programs can be viewed on the Parks and Recreation Facebook page and their You Tube channel.
