Pusch Ranch House Displays

February's display, *Black History and Arizona Statehood*, centered on Black History Month, and the March displays highlighted Women's *History Month*. Volunteers contributed a total of 1,984 hours during the year. The Jim Click Raffle garnered \$1,725 for the Society... Supporters of OVHS contributed \$9,784... Community outreach included a KGUN 9 interview with Devon Sloan, Basis Students project at the Ranch, tours for several PEO groups, and cooperation on an oral history project with Ironwood Ridge High School. 29 individuals served as docents in the past year.
