ADDITIONAL ORO VALLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY INFORMATION

- 1. Steam Pump Ranch Acquisition.
 - a. The eastern portion (about 9 acres) of the 15 acres being purchased is now in escrow. The final purchase and transfer of title could occur anytime.
 - b. The remaining 6 acres is being held up by a lawsuit between the former owner and the current owner who was proposing to a commercial development for the site. The Town is waiting for a court ruling which would allow for the transfer of the land to the Town even before the above mentioned lawsuit is settled.
 - c. The Town has formed a Master Plan Task Force who will work on establishing a proposed design for the entire site.

2. Corporate Donation.

a. The Wal-Mart Corporation has donated \$3000 to the Oro Valley Historical Society. A formal presentation of this donation is planned for the Grand Opening of the Wal-Mart Neighborhood Market located in Oro Valley at the Magee-Oracle intersection.
