Matt Jankowski from the Parks and Recreation Department reports that construction on the bunkhouses and the barbecue are coming along schedule and should be completed by July 29. There will be a ribbon cutting ceremony at 10:00 am on July 18. The town conducted Parents' Night Out and Family Camp Out on May 12 and 13. He noted that the Society could help with future camp outs with tours and historical story telling.

The future of the Procter-Leiber House is undecided as yet. Jankowski notes that this will be discussed with the new town manager.

Summer camps continue at the Ranch until the end of July. Paul Loomis is working with the Town Attorney, Tobin Sidles, on amendments to the license agreement between Oro Valley and OVHS.
