In September, the doors at the Pusch House Museum opened with an exhibit featuring "A Place In Time", timeline panels that focus on the history of Steam Pump Ranch and the Greater Oro Valley area. The timeline project was funded by a grant from the Arizona Historical Society and a donor. The exhibit also detailed the project process and specific elements of the timeline content. "A Place in Time" is part of the OVHS permanent exhibit at the Pusch House Museum.

Did you know that Steam Pump Ranch is one of only a few ranches in Arizona that was built in two eras under two private ownerships until its purchase by the Town of Oro Valley? George Pusch established the ranch circa 1875 and Jack Procter bought the ranch in a series of transactions beginning in 1938. Two of the rooms at the Pusch House Museum are dedicated to the Pusch family and Procter-Leiber family. A great place to learn local history!
