Native American Heritage Garden



Spring planting at the garden is ready to begin: the soil is being turned, compost and sulphur is being added and a flint corn is ready to be planted. Gourds, tomatillos and beans will go in mid March. Stay tuned for updates and if you would like to help, please contact us.

We are also starting to collect agave *murpheyi* plants -- the species cultivated by prehistoric Hohokam and more recently Apaches. We just planted 50 agaves near the garden to be used at a later date when the agave field is added.

Archival and Preservation of Documents

Monique Shephard (left) and Roxy Johnson have been busy every Tuesday morning working at the OV Library, scanning and digitizing the documents from the Pusch Ranch collection that Henry Zipf has given the OVHS. This process stores images of the documents as well as recording them in our *PastPerfect* software. The work is going slowly, but with definite progress as we have finished the first book of documents with several more to go.

Monique has been a very valuable asset to this project. She is working on her master's degree in Library Science and is volunteering at the library during her non-school time.




George Pusch, Native of Germany, USA Citizenship Certificate - March 25, 1876
